A note from the Pastor

On March, 17, 2020, I announced that we would not be meeting in person for at least two weeks. March 22 marked the first Sunday that we had online only worship. We did not meet again in person for worship until we met outdoors on May 31. For ten Sundays, we only met remotely. As difficult as it was, I am thankful we could use technology to share in worship and the Word together.

We again have an uptick in Covid cases in our community. Our governor has issued several mandates regarding our state's resurgence. Per the state's policy last summer, churches are exempt from the mandates, but encouraged to follow state guidelines. At First Baptist we will do our best to honor the state so long as it does not call us to compromise the Word of God.

What does this mean for our church? Well, for starters, **respect governing authorities**. Following the state right now means that indoor church gatherings are recommended, but not mandated, to wear masks. So we would like to recommend, but not require, that you consider wearing face coverings.

Secondly, be respectful of each family's decision regarding precautions. That means not judging a person's decision regarding masks, social distancing, or vaccinations. Be respectful of people's space, particularly if they are taking precautions. As a general rule, if someone is wearing a mask, ask permission before you move into their personal space. And be courteous of those who ask for you to keep your distance.

Third, we will be marking off certain portions of the building as "mask required". During worship on Sunday mornings, the fellowship hall and the overflow section of the sanctuary will require masks. Please take note of the signs and wear a mask when entering these areas. Beginning September 5, the service will once again be streamed to the fellowship hall for those who want extra social distance.

Fourth, if you are sick or have been around someone who is sick, please stay home. We have encouraged this even before Covid as a way to help stop transmission of a variety of illnesses including Covid, flu, or other contagious viruses and bugs. Thus far, we have been fortunate to have zero cases of Covid originate from one of our services or activities. This is in large part to people following this principle.

Finally, **stay united**. There is nothing that the devil wants more than for churches to argue over government regulations. We are not in the business of appeasing governments or people. As a church, we are called to gospel ministry. We will remain faithful to worship, discipleship, service, evangelism, care, and fellowship. We have one mission, one gospel, and one salvation under one God. The people of First Baptist remain committed to gospel ministry.

Online worship can never fully replace a gathered church. As always, we encourage you to worship in person with us. However, if you have a need to stay at home for a season, you can continue to watch online at www.fbcrobinson.com/live.


